Recommit yourselves to praying daily, reading Scriptures and staying faithful to Gods commandments. Pray together that through this Advent season your family will be most prepared to receive Jesus when he comes again.

THE ADVENT CANDLE



The Advent Wreath is a visual symbol marking the progress of the season of Advent, originating as a domestic devotion and an opportunity for family prayer. It functions as a simple countdown-timer for the passage of Advent.

It is important to place the wreath in such a way so that it maintains the centrality of the essential symbols for the assembly: Font, Word, and Table.

Blessing of the Advent Wreath (ETWN)

A minister who is a priest or deacon says the prayer of blessing with hands outstretched; a lay minister says the prayer with hands joined.

Priest: Lord God,

your Church joyfully awaits the coming of its Savior, who enlightens our hearts and dispels the darkness of ignorance and sin.

Pour forth your blessings upon us as we light the candles of this wreath;

may their light reflect the splendour of Christ, who is Lord, for ever and ever.

All: Amen.

CHRISTMAS EVE : THE CHRIST CANDLE

Before the service starts, the altar candles and the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th Candles of are lit. At the end of the procession by the wreath the Priest or Deacon reads:

And she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them. And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." (*Luke 2:7-12) NIV*

This prayer is said as the Christ candle is lit

God our Father, today the Savior is born and those who live in darkness are seeing a great light. Help us, who greet the birth of Christ with joy, to live in the light of your Son and to share the good news of your love. We ask this through Jesus Christ, the light who has come into the world. Amen.

Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth; and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.'" (Luke 3:2b-6)

ADVENT CANDLE LITURGY

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT—CANDLE OF HOPE

If the Advent wreath candles are lit at the beginning of a Sunday service, the ceremony should be brief. The Advent antiphon (BCP, page 43 or 80) may be said in unison or responsively (BOS—Book of Occasional Services)

Priest:

Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you must also be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.

(Matthew 24:42-44)
